






ABOUT US



Kiborgoch Community Wildlife and Wetland Conservancy lies on Gps of; 0°21'6"N, 36°3'47"E and hosts three locations Lobo, Kapkuikui and Sandai, Situated 1KM away from L. Bogoria National Game Reserve and opposite to Lake Bogoria Spa Resort. This conservancy was launched and officially opened 31st March 2021. However it was registered in the year 2015. It hosts wildlife such as Greater Kudu, reedbucks' antelopes, waterbucks, hippopotamus among other wildlife. Generally it's a home of vast ecosystem biodiversity.



Ecosystem & Wildlife

The conservancy boasts of diverse ecosystem comprising both dry & wetlands. The wetland is adorned with lush thickets of Papyrus reeds and serves as a haven for a number of wildlife and birds, including but not limited to reedbuck, waterbuck, zebras, wild pigs, crocodiles, pythons, ostriches, hippos, warthogs, and a various of birds species.



Tourist Attractions

The conservancy offers a rich array of attractions for tourists. Visitors can encounter with diverse wildlife and birds, interact with the local Endorois community, and engage in exciting adventures activities. It's a complete experience blending nature, culture, and adventure.



Cultural Heritage

Inhabiting the conservancy is the indigenous Endorois Community, a Tugen sub-tribe rich with culture and a unique lifestyle, including their traditional cuisine, clothing and customs. The conservancy has both women & men cultural dancing groups who warmly welcome visitors in a cultural style. They entertain guests with traditional songs, dances and dress them in their traditional attire, creating an immersive experience that connects visitors with nature and offers the opportunity to interact with the local community.
