# MOROP -TARAMBAS COMMUNITY CONSERVANCY

## Brief overview of the conservancy

Morop -Tarambas Community Conservancy is located in Baringo County, Kenya 13.5km from Kabarnet Town. The conservancy sits on 2100 ha of land. This conservancy is a community-driven initiative aimed at wildlife and habitat conservation, as well as sustainable natural resource management. It's designed to protect the environment, preserve biodiversity, and promote sustainable ecotourism that supports the local community's livelihoods.

## Wildlife And Ecosystem

The conservancy is often managed and protected by local communities and plays a vital role in wildlife conservation and sustainable land use. It is also a home to a wide variety of wildlife and ecosystems including:

- Rock hyrax
- Dik dik
- Ant eater
- Owls
- Red cedar
- Sandalwood
- Unique butterflies
- White & black Columbus monkeys

## Tourism Attractions & Activities

Some of the activities tourists can engage themselves when they visit this conservancy include; hiking, team building, nature walks, canopy viewing bird watching, fishing from Kirandich Dam, health therapies and conservation activities. There are also various attractions in this conservancy including: wildlife, the famous Morop hill, Kikocho waterfall, the cultural centre, Kirandich Dam and Tunnel, Ngwenop Paramut cave, Kaptuotui historical site and various viewpoints such as the Morop top view point, Tarambas viewpoint, and Katiin viewpoint.

## Guided Tours & Safaris

Tourists and visitors get the luxury of enjoying nature and adventure around the conservancy with the help of trained tour guides.

## The Famous Morop Hill

It was named "Morop" by locals, with "Rop" meaning "Rain" in Tugen community, and "More" is an English comparative adjective meaning "greater quantity", also known as Elephant Mountain, due to its distinct shape that resembles an elephant facing south. Standing at 2061 metres

above the sea level, it's Baringo's third-highest point after Saimo and Kimng'ochoch, offering a 360-degree view of Baringo and early morning view of Mt. Kenya. The road to the top of the hill was built by locals in 1953 for Queen Elizabeth's visit (cancelled due to her father's death). The hill is sacred, where locals pray for rain.
