Sinibo Aspiring Geosite Conservancy, with 300 members, was founded to protect and showcase the community's rich natural resources while attracting both local and international tourists to its remarkable geological site. Its mission is to become a global hub for geological research and conservation.

At its core, Sinibo features a key archaeological site filled with fascinating fossils such as the Lokichard molar, hippo molars, rhino premolars, giraffe hooves, and other small animal remains. These relics highlight the area's historical and scientific importance, providing valuable insights for research and education. As a vital wildlife corridor, Sinibo supports the migration of elephants, lions, rhinos, and antelopes to the Kamnorok National Reserve. To promote harmony between wildlife and local communities, the conservancy engages in education and advocacy efforts.

In addition to conservation, Sinibo is reclaiming land through gabion construction, terrace building, and planting cover crops to control soil and water erosion. Beekeeping and the restoration of indigenous trees, which boost honey production, support the local economy.

## Future Plans

Future plans include a campsite for visitors to experience the site's natural beauty and history. With backing from BCCA and the Baringo County Government, Sinibo is committed to restoring the land and preserving it for future generations.
